NPORS experienced worker tests are designed for those operatives who have operated machinery but do not yet have a formal qualification to operate but have received inhouse training and supervision.

Experienced worker tests take the format of theory in the morning session, including a written test with a practical in the afternoon where the operative is required to achieve a required standard to obtain the operator licence.

Novice tests are available and take from 3 -5 days to complete.

NPORS training is £500 + travel at cost per day plus £40 per person to cover administration and charges made by the scheme for the card production.

Delegates must provide a photograph or agree to have a photograph taken for submission to the scheme.
